COURSE LISTINGS

(1) Instructor Methodology: Friday Night

If you're a company officer or instructor tasked with training your crew, this course is for you. Learn proven methods to communicate clearly, teach from a plan, and run effective hands-on drills. Emphasis on adult learning, skill development, and what works in the field. **Fulfills KY Fire Commission's Instructor Update requirement.**

(2) PPE Everything You Need to Know: Friday Night

You wear your gear every shift, make sure you know it inside and out. Learn how to select, inspect, clean, and maintain turnout gear that protects you. We'll break down NFPA 1970 & 1851, explain what matters, and wrap up with a live gear inspection so you can spot wear and damage before it becomes a problem.

(3) Firefighting Foam Application: Friday Night

1st TIME OFFERED AT PIKE CO F.S

This course provides firefighters with a fundamental understanding of firefighting foam (Class A, Class B), the apparatus and equipment needed to deliver them, and procedures for safe, effective application. Through class lectures and hands-on demonstration, participants will learn to manage foam operations. Demonstrations will be done with a NEW foam product SOYFOAM. ***SPECIAL THANKS TO SOYFOAM SOLUTIONS***

4) Swift Water Rescue Awareness: Friday Night

Water calls are high-risk. This awareness-level course gives you the knowledge to recognize Swiftwater hazards, support operations, and stay safe on scene. Covers flood dynamics, rescue zones, PPE, and incident priorities.

Required before taking Swift Water Rescue Operations.

5) Autism Awareness: Friday Night

Participants will learn how to identify the characteristics of autism & understand how to interaction may be impacted, understand how to engage, respond to, & interact with autistic – including communication and de-escalation strategies, review local, state-wide & national resources related to autism. ***SPECIAL THANKS TO THE AVA CENTER OF PIKEVILLE***

(6) EMT Con-Ed: Friday – Sunday (20 hrs.)

Sharpen your skills and check off your KBEMS-required 20 hours. This course is fast-paced, hands-on, and relevant. Topics include airway management, trauma, medical calls, cardiac care, and scene operations—all tailored to what EMTs and EMRs deal with on the street. Topics that will be covered include the following: Airway, Medical, Trauma, Cardiac, and Operations.

(7) Drone Operations: Saturday Only

Unmanned drones are being increasingly used by the fire service. Drones with video camera capabilities offer a great opportunity to assess information from significant incidents and large-scale events and provide that information to the incident commander to help keep firefighters and other responders from unnecessary danger. This course will cover using a drone as a mission tool and provide the student with a better understanding of standard operating procedures, training, management, operations, mitigation and will also discuss certificates of authorization.

(8) Firefighter's Well Being: Sunday Only

This class will combine Firefighter Cancer Awareness and Mental Health 1st Aid for the 1st Responder. Topics that will be covered for both will be; earlier detections, assistance programs available, statistics that affects 1st Responders, and how you can help yourself or any other member of your department.

(9) Swiftwater Rescue Operations:

Prerequisite: Swiftwater Awareness

This hands-on course trains responders to execute defensive lifesaving and shore-based rescues in Swiftwater and flood conditions. You'll work as a team in live water, using proven rescue techniques. **Full participation is required.** ATTENDANCE PREFERENCE WILL BE GIVEN TO THOSE WHO HAVE NEVER TAKEN SWIFT WATER OPS CLASS

Gear required: Vented helmet, Type III or V PFD. Wetsuit/drysuit optional.

No juniors. Limit: 25 students.

(10) Basic Vehicle Extrication:

This class is for the brand NEW person in the department that has no or very limited knowledge of vehicle extrication. Topics that will be covered are stabilization, removing glass, simple door and roof removal and dash rolls. This class will include lectures and hands-on

Gear required: Full turnout gear or extrication suit, gloves, boots, helmet, eye protection.

(11) You Pick It:

Need hours? We've got you. This flexible course is designed around your training needs. Bring a list of topics you're short on. We'll vote as a group and knock them out. Great for rounding out requirements or getting rare hours.

Note: No Fire Commission (FC) classes will be offered.

(12) Basic Firefighting Skills:

Perfect for new firefighters or as a skills refresher. Hands-on training in key areas:

- Foam
- PPE
- Salvage & overhaul
- Forcible entry
- Hose & nozzles
- Ladders
- Ventilation
- Search & rescue

Gear required: Full turnout gear and SCBA. Max: 30 students.

(13) Challenges for Today's Fire Service

1st Time Offered at Pike Co. FS

This 2-day class covers a wide range of topics for the modern fire service. The first day's focus will be reviewing leadership & management styles along with safety aspects of firefighting in today's environment. Day 2 will focus on different challenges that we face each day in the fire service, and how we want to be remembered when we leave our organization. We will also examine building a winning team to accomplish the various tasks we encounter. Participant participation is required in this class. Each of the topics discussed should generate various ideas that you can take back to your organization. This OFFICERS training class was written by and will be taught by:

(14) CAMS & CANS

1st TIME OFFERED AT PIKE CO F.S

LIVE FIRE TRAINING ON SUNDAY

This class is designed to build confidence in two of the most misused tools in the fire service 1). Thermal Imaging Cameras and 2). The 2 ½ gallon Class "A" water extinguisher. This two (2) day class will focus on Saturday, the operational functionality of Thermal Imaging Cameras in a "Live Fire" environment and utilize Thermal Imaging Cameras for victim search. Students will learn common functionality across all cameras, modifications, care and maintenance, use, and special considerations. Sunday will focus on the use of Class "A" fire extinguishers in a **"LIVE FIRE"** environment. Students will learn the construction of Class "A" Extinguishers, modifications, various carry techniques, various deployment techniques, and special considerations. Finally, **students will perform live fire attacks with nothing more than a Class "A" water extinguisher on pre-flashover conditions.**

This class will be a hands-on class, students will be required to have 10-year compliant interior structural firefighting turn-out gear, SCBA (with extra cylinder), no beards/goatees, and have vitals checked in accordance with NFPA 1403/1584. **SPECIAL THANKS TO PYE-BARKER FIRE & SAFETY AND AMERICA'S BRAVEST**

Gear required: Full turnout gear and SCBA with spare cylinder

JRFF Program Coordinator **SHALL** provide all JRFF's with a Training and Emergency Contact Information Form prior to the JRFF attending classes outside of the JRFF primary department. The information included above is required at a minimum. Fire Departments may collect more information if necessary.

Inform participating Junior Firefighters that they must keep a copy of this form with them at all times while participating in the fire department activities. Class instructors and/or school/conference leadership may randomly request to see a copy of the form during the conduct of classes and/or event. If the participant is unable to provide a copy, the instructor, other department leadership, or conference organizers shall not allow the child to continue participation until the form is produced.

Live Fire Course Competency Validation/Fitness for Duty Form

Required for all students before participating in SFRT Live Fire Training

NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) 4.3.1 - 4.3.3 require that all participants must have prior training and meet prerequisites in certain subjects before participating in live fire training. These minimum subjects include:

1) Safety; 2) Fire Behavior; 3) Portable Extinguishers; 4) Personal Protective Equipment & SCBA; 5) Ladders; 6) Fire Hose, Appliances, and Streams; 7) Overhaul; 8) Water Supply; 9) Ventilation; 10) Forcible Entry; 11) Building Construction. Specific prerequisite training must also be met in these areas: Fire Dynamics; Health and Safety; Fundamentals of Fire Behavior; Fire Development in Compartments; Nozzle Techniques and Door Control.

The Chief Officer of _____ Fire Department
authorizes that _____ completed the minimum
training/prerequisites and may participate in the live fire training evolutions present by SFRT.

NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) 4.4.1 requires that all participants must be rehabbed in accordance with NFPA 1584, Chapter 6. Before being released from the rehab area to participate in a State Fire Rescue Training live fire training evolution, normal conditions are considered to consist of: heart rate of 60-100; respiratory rate of 12-20; systolic blood pressure less than 160; diastolic blood pressure of less than 100; pulse oximetry of 95% or greater. Participants are encouraged to periodically check their vital signs and seek appropriate medical attention for abnormal signs/symptoms.

Participants must be a member of a Fire Department, Industrial Fire Brigade or Junior Firefighter program (Ages 15-17) that is recognized by the Kentucky Fire Commission to participate in live fire training delivered by State Fire Rescue Training. ID's will be checked by SFRT instructors before allowing students to participate in live fire training and some evolutions/activities are restricted for 15-17 year old Junior Firefighters (See current Junior Firefighter Guidelines on KY Fire Commission website.) All turnout gear must be less than 10 years of age. Per NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) A4.9.5 it is recommended that all participants wear full-length clothing made of natural fibers or fire-retardant materials under their personal protective equipment during live fire evolutions.

Facepiece seal protection: SFRT requires that all students must be compliant with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134:

"1910.134(g)(1)(i)" - The employer shall not permit respirators with tight-fitting facepieces to be worn by employees who have: 1910.134(g)(1)(i)(A) - Facial hair that comes between the sealing surface of the facepiece and the face or that interferes with valve function;" (hair growth between the skin and the facepiece sealing surface, such as stubble beard growth, beard, mustache or sideburns which cross the respirator sealing surface).
