

Classes

Vehicle Extrication (Saturday & Sunday)
 This class will be a fast paced hands-on course that will cover several different real life extrication and stabilization scenarios.
 Turnout gear/extrication suit, fire helmet/hardhat, eye protection, gloves and steel toed boots required.

2. Firefighter Survival (Saturday)

This class will show different techniques a firefighter can use when the primary escape route has become blocked or if caught in a rapidly deteriorating situation. Full PPE and SCBA required.

3. Firefighter Rescue (Sunday)

This class will show different ways to remove a trapped or unconscious firefighter who has become a victim themselves. Full PPE and SCBA required.

4. Hard-to-Get Hours I (Saturday)

This class will cover hours that are hard to find, including Emergency & Disaster Planning-2hrs; Fire Protection Systems-3hrs; Fire Behavior(with Max Fire Box)-3hrs

5. Hard-to-Get Hours II (Sunday)

Sunday: Aircraft-3hrs; Loss Control-3hrs; Foam Fire Streams-2hrs

6. Pumper Operations (Saturday & Sunday)

This course will cover various aspects of the operations of fire pumps, utilizing both classroom and hands-on learning. Many different facets will be covered for both urban and rural pumping operations.

7. Flashover Recognition & Survival (Saturday)

The purpose of this course is to provide Kentucky's Fire Service with a safe and secure system of flashover recognition and survival training, which is aimed at saving firefighters from death and injury. Recognition of an impending flashover and techniques that may provide time to escape is discussed in this class.

Full PPE and SCBA is required. All turnout gear will be inspected and cannot be 10 years old prior to participating in live fire training. LIVE FIRE Course Competency Validation Form must be filled out & returned.

8. Working Under Fire Conditions (Sunday)

This is a LIVE FIRE course that will cover many of the tasks that are required on the fire ground. Forcible Entry, Loss Control, Ventilation & Hose Handling are just a few of the skills that students will be performing during this class while encountering both 1-story and below grade fires. Full PPE and SCBA w/ spare cylinder is required. All turnout gear will be inspected and cannot be 10 years old prior to participating in live fire training. LIVE FIRE Course Competency Validation Form must be filled out & returned.

9. Instructor Methodology Update (Friday evening)

This class meets the requirements set forth by the Kentucky Fire Commission for instructor biannual re-certification.

10. Wildland Awareness (Friday evening)

This course is the Fire Commission's mandatory 4-hour instruction on wildland firefighting. The course will cover the minimum training required for certification as a firefighter in Kentucky.

Live Fire Course Competency Validation/Fitness for Duty Form Required for all students before participating in SFRT Live Fire Training

NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) 4.3.1 - 4.3.3 require that all participants must have prior training and meet prerequisites in certain subjects before participating in live fire training. These minimum subjects include:

1) Safety; 2) Fire Behavior; 3) Portable Extinguishers; 4) Personal Protective Equipment & SCBA; 5) Ladders; 6) Fire Hose, Appliances, and Streams; 7) Overhaul; 8) Water Supply; 9) Ventilation; 10) Forcible Entry; 11) Building Construction. Specific prerequisite training must also be met in these areas: Fire Dynamics; Health and Safety; Fundamentals of Fire Behavior; Fire Development in Compartments; Nozzle Techniques and Door Control.

The Chief Officer of	Fire Department
authorizes that	completed the minimum

training/prerequisites and may participate in the live fire training evolutions present by SFRT.

NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) 4.4.1 requires that all participants must be rehabbed in accordance with NFPA 1584, Chapter 6. Before being released from the rehab area to participate in a State Fire Rescue Training live fire training evolution, normal conditions are considered to consist of: heart rate of 60-100; respiratory rate of 12-20; systolic blood pressure less than 160; diastolic blood pressure of less than 100; pulse oximetry of 95% or greater. Participants are encouraged to periodically check their vital signs and seek appropriate medical attention for abnormal signs/symptoms.

Participants must be a member of a Fire Department, Industrial Fire Brigade or Junior Firefighter program (Ages 15-17) that is recognized by the Kentucky Fire Commission to participate in live fire training delivered by State Fire Rescue Training. ID's will be checked by SFRT instructors before allowing students to participate in live fire training and some evolutions/activities are restricted for 15-17 year old Junior Firefighters (See current Junior Firefighter Guidelines on KY Fire Commission website.) All turnout gear must be less than 10 years of age. Per NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) A4.9.5 it is recommended that all participants wear full-length clothing made of natural fibers or fire-retardant materials under their personal protective equipment during live fire evolutions.

Facepiece seal protection: SFRT requires that all students must be compliant with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134: "<u>1910.134(g)(1)(i)</u>-The employer shall not permit respirators with tight-fitting facepieces to be worn by employees who have: <u>1910.134(g)(1)(i)(A)</u> - Facial hair that comes between the sealing surface of the facepiece and the face or that interferes with valve function;" (hair growth between the skin and the facepiece sealing surface, such as stubble beard growth, beard, mustache or sideburns which cross the respirator sealing surface).
