COURSE LISTINGS

(1) Flashover Recognition and Survival is a basic level course created and adopted with the goal of improving firefighter recognition and survival techniques for rapid fire progression and related events. The "Awareness" level course is lecture based and topics include but are not limited to: Basic fire behavior and fire development, potential signs, elements, and indicators of Flashover and Backdraft; tactical ventilation and survival techniques. Relevant case studies may also be discussed during this course. This course is required for certification.

(2) Wildland FF Awareness is required for certification of those that had (0) training hours as of July 1, 2001. It is based on the S-130 and S-190 courses but takes into account specific information related to Kentucky. It is a lecture-based class focused on the topics of fire behavior, tools, equipment, suppression, urban interface, and Wildland firefighting safety. *This course is required for certification.*

(3) Active Shooter Fire Departments are increasingly called upon to assist in complex and large Criminal Mass Casualty Incidents (C-MCI). C-MCI has led to specific recommendations & guidelines between fire/ems and law enforcement agencies. We invite you to engage in awareness level training for better management of pre-incident planning & how to best mitigate causalities in a C-MCI event.

(4) Rope Rescue Awareness this class will cover basic knots & hitches. Go over the different types of rope and the use of each type. THIS CLASS IS A PREREQUISITE FOR THE ROPE RESCUE OPERATIONS

(5) Firefighter Survival will emphasize removal of trapped or unconscious firefighters from a burning building and self-rescue techniques when the primary escape route is blocked. This is a required course for all new firefighters effective 7/1/2000. Full turnout gear and SCBA are required.

(6) Firefighter Rescue is designed to teach the firefighter how to rescue victims from a burning structure. Special techniques are used for rescue. This course will test your skills to the limit. This is a required course for all new firefighters effective 7/1/2001. The student must have taken the FF Survival Course before taking the FF Rescue Course. Full turnout gear and SCBA are required.

(7) *Basic Firefighting Skills* This 2-day course is primarily hands -on training. Topics covered will be fire extinguisher, PPE, salvage & overhaul, forcible entry, hose nozzle & appliances, ventilation, ladders, victim search & rescue. (30 MAX.) <u>FULL TURN-OUT GEAR & SCBA REQUIRED</u>

(8) Haz-Mat Awareness & Operations (8A) HAZ-MAT AWARENESS STARTS FRIDAY NIGHT 6:00 – 10:00PM

Provides information to 1st responders on how to recognize the presence. of hazardous materials, protecting themselves, call for help & deny entry into the area. **THIS CLASS WILL END SATURDAY AT LUNCH**

HAZ-MAT OPERATION (8B) THIS CLASS WILL BEGIN SATURDAY AFTER LUNCH & RUN ALL DAY SUNDAY Provides information for first responders to recognize the presence of hazardous materials, respond in

Provides information for first responders to recognize the presence of hazardous materials, respond in a defensive mode to control the release & spread of the product, thereby protecting life & property.

(9) Advanced Vehicle Extrication students should have the basic knowledge and experience of vehicle extrication. This will be classroom and hands-on. Students will be performing extrication on vehicles that have been T Bone, under ride, vehicle on their side and top. Students will be performing extrication on large vehicles such as buses also.

All students will need appropriate PPE (turnout gear or extrication suits. Gloves, Boots, Helmet & Eye protection

(10) Rope Rescue Operations. This 2 day class will cover tools and equipment used for rope rescue, mechanical advantages, low angle rope rescue, packaging patients and if time allows some high angle rescue All students will need a rock helmet, swift water helmet, USAR helmet OR fire helmet; rope gloves, extrication gloves OR any leather type gloves, (no fire gloves permitted); closed toe boots, (no sneakers or fire boots permitted).

(11) <u>Advanced Fire Ground Operations</u> is a two-day intense hands-on class that will challenge even the veteran firefighter. Subjects covered will be hose handling, fire attack, ventilation, forcible entry, and search and rescue. Students will be challenged every step of the way in this class so be prepared to work and learn. Sunday we will be doing a HOUSE BURN. YOU MUST ATTEND SATURDAY'S CLASS TO PARTICIPATE IN LIVE FIRE EVOLUTIONS. Full PPE including SCBA and an extra bottle is required on this course. NO BEARDS OR GOTEES ALLOWED <u>A Live Fire Competency</u> <u>Validation Form</u> MUST be completed in full and given to the Lead Instructor prior to participation in the Live Fire portions of this class. Which is attached and feel free to make as many copies as you need

(12) Preparation for Initial Officer (P.I.C.O.) The primary objective for this 2-day class is to develop a better understanding of the role & responsibilities of a Company Officer in preparing the company for incident operations. In addition, this course will help students clarify the transition from firefighter to Company Officer & the new roles relating to leadership and safety.
