NFPA REGULATIONS & REQUIRED FORMS

All applicable NFPA Standards are strictly followed and enforced. Courses requiring NFPA 1403 prerequisite(s) or firefighter certification require a **signed approval form from the fire chief submitted with payment** (pages 21-22). All rules concerning turnout gear age and facial hair apply, make sure you are prepared for your class.

NFA REQUIREMENTS

For National Fire Academy courses, a FEMA Student Identification number must be created/entered on the application form for credit for the course. You will be able to apply for a FEMA Student Identification number during class. If you already have one, please make sure you have it for class.

JUNIOR FIREFIGHTERS & REQUIRED FORMS

Junior Firefighters **must be from a KY Fire Commission recognized Jr. Firefighter Program and submit a completed Jr. FF permission release form (page 20) and can only register for designated courses.**

- Junior firefighters will be allowed into some courses based on the current Kentucky Fire Commission Junior Firefighter regulations.

Course Listing Description

ARSON 1 (Y0001)

16 HOURS SATURDAY/SUNDAY

The purpose of this course is to provide first responders with the tools to understand the key role they play in fire scene examination and in preserving and protecting important evidence for any subsequent investigation. The content of the course will provide a clear definition of the role of the first responder and identify the preservation and protection of FIR 1035 in the KCTCS Fire Science Technology Program.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: None



AUTISM AWARENESS (II0002)/

First Responder Mental Health Awareness (KK0000)

8 HOURS SATURDAY

The Autism Awareness course is intended to instruct firefighters, EMT's, paramedics, and police officers on how to recognize the characteristics of autism using video demonstration to illustrate some of these characteristics. This course also provides the first responder with strategies to initiate a relationship and methods to de-escalate a situation if it were to become untenable. Resources are made available to the students for further education concerning autism.

The First Responder Mental Health Awareness course is intended to instruct firefighters, EMT's, paramedics, and police officers on how to recognize the warning signs of suicide and question, persuade, and refer people at risk for suicide for help. Mental health experts specializing in first responder care will be on hand to lead this class.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: None



BASIC FIREFIGHTING (various codes/categories)

16 HOURS SATURDAY/SUNDAY

This course covers many of the recommended hours for a new firefighter in Kentucky and offers both classroom and hands-on training. We changed the format from years past and have expanded several sections to provide better skills-based training opportunity in those categories.

- PPE—F0000 (2 hours)
- Forcible Entry—G0000 (2 hours)
- Ventilation—H0000 (2 hours)
- Ropes—I0000 (2 hours)
- Ladders—J0000 (2 hours)
- Hose/Nozzles/Appliances—K0000 (2 hours)
- Portable Extinguishers – E0000 (2 hours)
- Overhaul – N0000 (2 hours)

Equipment Needed: Full Turnout Gear and SCBA, including PASS device.

Prerequisites: Permission Form if Jr. FF and a willingness to work! This is a physically challenging course.

CHAPLAIN TRAINING (JJ0000)

8 HOURS SUNDAY

This course is designed to teach the layperson necessary skills to help fire departments in times of spiritual and emotional trauma or crisis. A discussion on suicide prevention for emergency responders is planned.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: None

Command and Control (AA0000)

16 HOURS SATURDAY/SUNDAY

This class offers a solid review of the tools to get you started commanding a scene using the acronyms SAW, CSS, RECEO, and VSS while using the NFA Primary Size up chart. Day One is an ICS-Command/Control lecture with several breakout tabletop exercises using the Tactics and Strategy Fundamentals. The following days will consist of working in the "CommandSim" interactive software designed for fire ground scenarios where each person will rotate from computer to computer to change on-scene roles. "CommandSim" is an invaluable tool that will allow us to train in a dynamic, real-time environment which can only be replicated with actual fire ground experience.

Equipment Needed: Notebook and pen/pencil. Students are encouraged to bring a laptop computer to class.

Prerequisites: Basic understanding of the Incident Command System

Driver's Training (CC0000)

16 HOURS SATURDAY/SUNDAY

This is the Kentucky Fire Commission approved curriculum for Driver's Training. Topics such as safe operation of fire apparatus, laws regulating operation, and frequent causes of accidents will be discussed. This course has been updated to include additional information and skills on inspection of apparatus.

It concludes with skills on the cone course. Students should be prepared to take a short, written exam at the conclusion of the course.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: Valid Kentucky Driver's License and vehicle insurance

eFire Legal Workshop (A0000)

8 HOURS SATURDAY

This course will cover the legalities of the Fire Service. In this course, topics such as Fire Scene control, boundaries and liabilities, and new fire laws changing in today's world. There will be reference to KRS 75, KRS 273 CVFD, & KRS 95. There will be personal stories from Fire chiefs who have served prison time, and coverage on Firefighter gun rights and Ky child protection laws. A round table discussion for legal questions and answers will also take place. Course will be led by Former Assistant Attorney General, Maurice "Mo" Byrne, Attorney at Law.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: None



EMS Continuing Education (See Description)

20 HOURS FRIDAY/SATURDAY/SUNDAY

This course will provide the 20 hours of the NREMT 2016 NCCP Model that will meet the requirements as the national component for KY EMT recertification. Course material will be adjusted for both Emergency Medical Responders and EMT-Basics.

Equipment Needed: CPR Mask, gloves, stethoscope, and blood pressure cuff

Prerequisites: EMT Certification or EMR Certification, Permission Form if Jr. FF

Farm Rescue (Q0006)

8 HOURS SATURDAY

The 2024 Farm Rescue class will be an 8-hour class broken into 2–4-hour blocks of some of the best farm classes. This course will consist of Farm Rescue and Heavy Farm Rescue. There will be a team of some of the best Farm rescue instructors from both Kentucky and Tennessee (The Tennessee Association of Rescue). This course will demonstrate tractor rollovers and large tractors on top of vehicles. Along with the Farm Rescue, the course will also cover working with heavy rotator wreckers and all different varieties of rescue tools.

Equipment Needed: Gloves, Helmet, safety Glasses or Goggles, Coverall or jump suit or turnout gear.

Prerequisites: *This will primarily be a hands-on class. Come ready to work.*



Grain Rescue (Q0006)

8 HOURS SUNDAY

Grain Emergencies claim the lives of several every year. While we watch the news and see where a fire department or rescue company work to rescue or recover an individual, we may not fully understand the complexity of the operations and the specialized equipment required to perform those operations. This class will provide the opportunity to get in the grain with a simulated emergency and perform the steps to free the person utilizing a grain rescue tube. Dale Dobson with the KY Department of Agriculture will be on hand to show several options of grain rescue tubes and each will be available to use in the grain.

Equipment Needed: Goggles, Gloves and Head protection

Fire Behavior/Control-Live Burn – Multiple Live Burn Props (M0001)

8 HOURS SUNDAY

This is a NFPA 1403 compliant **LIVE-FIRE** course which will utilize the FireBlast and Car Fire prop. This course will prepare the student for IFSAC Firefighter I and II testing by using all available props utilized during testing scenarios.



Equipment Needed: Full turnout gear and SCBA with PASS device and spare cylinder. All turnout gear must be NFPA compliant with no component older than 10 years. Students will not be allowed to participate if the instructor(s) find that the gear is not NFPA compliant or otherwise poses a hazard. SCBA cylinders must have a current hydrostatic test date.

Prerequisites: Completion of NFPA 1403 required components prior to enrolling;” Live Fire Course Competency Validation” form (pages 21-22) must be mailed in with payment. Any student with facial hair that impedes the seal of the face piece will not be allowed to participate in accordance with NFPA Standards.

Flashover Trailer – Skills Required (FC40000/FC41000)

8 HOURS SATURDAY

This is a skills required full flashover course consisting of lecture component and required skills. This is a NFPA 1403 compliant **LIVE-FIRE** course which will utilize the Flashover burn trailer.

Equipment Needed: Full turnout gear and SCBA with PASS device and spare cylinder. All turnout gear must be NFPA compliant with no component older than 10 years. Students will not be allowed to participate if the instructor(s) find that the gear is not NFPA compliant or otherwise poses a hazard. SCBA cylinders must have a current hydrostatic test date.

Prerequisites: Completion of NFPA 1403 required components prior to enrolling;” Live Fire Course Competency Validation” form (pages 21-22) must be mailed in with payment. Any student with facial hair that impedes the seal of the face piece will not be allowed to participate in accordance with NFPA Standards.



Fire Inspector I (DD0001)

8 HOURS SUNDAY

This class is the first step in the Fire Marshal's revised Fire Inspector program. Fire and building code officials will benefit from this course. This class will provide instruction based on NFPA 1, 2018 Fire Code, NFPA 101, 2018 Life Safety Code, the Kentucky Standards of Safety (815 KAR 10:060) and the Kentucky Building Code. Officials will learn basic principles of fire inspections, and how it relates to the KBC and IBC. This class will consist of one fast paced day of instruction followed by an exam. Certificates are issued upon passing the test.

Course Objective: Prepare the attendees to conduct fire inspections of buildings for fire hazards and code compliance per 815 KAR 10:060 (The Kentucky Standards of Safety). Determine if fire protection equipment is operational, maintained and in compliance. Determine the adequacy of exits. Determine an occupant load for a facility. Where required, emergency fire evacuation drills are held. Advise property owners of the inspector's findings. Gain an understanding of projects that must be approved by the Division of Building Code Enforcement and other Divisions within the Department of Housing, Building and Construction.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: None

This is a 1-day course offering 8 HRS for Continuing education of Fire Safety and Building Code Certification

Fire Inspector II (DD0002)

8 HOURS SATURDAY

This class is the second step in the Fire Marshal's revised Fire Inspector program. This class is designed for fire inspectors and building code officials that deal with life safety issues on a daily basis. The students will get detailed instruction on specific occupancy requirements, occupant load calculations and seating arrangements. This class will consist of instruction followed by an exam. Certificates are issued upon passing the test.

Course Objective:

Attendees will be instructed in the performance of and requirements for complex fire inspections and code recognition. Gain knowledge in occupant load calculation and seating arrangement in places of assembly, fair and exposition centers, and special events.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: Fire Inspector I, verified by a copy of your Inspector I certificate and 6 months in the performance of inspections verified by your Chief or Supervisor.

This is a 1-day course offering 8 HRS for Continuing education of Fire Safety and Building Code Certification



Firefighter Survival – Skills Required (FC10000/FC11000) 8 HOURS SATURDAY

This course is designed to help firefighters save themselves when trapped or involved in an impending emergency. The full course with skills is required for Kentucky Basic II Firefighter certification.

Equipment Needed: Full turnout gear including SCBA and PASS device

Prerequisites Permission Form if Jr. FF. Note – this is a physically demanding course.



Firefighter Rescue – Skills Required (FC20000/FC21000) 8 HOURS SUNDAY

This course is designed for firefighters to describe and/or demonstrate techniques commonly used in firefighter rescue situations. The full course with skills is required for Kentucky Basic II Firefighter Certification.

Equipment Needed: Full turnout gear including SCBA and PASS device

Prerequisites: Permission Form if Jr. FF. **Note – this is a physically demanding course.**



Flashover Awareness (FC40000)/ Wildland (FC30000) Lecture Only 8 HOURS SUNDAY

Flashover Awareness class: This basic-level lecture only course was created and adopted with the goal of improving firefighter recognition and survival techniques for rapid fire progression and related events. This course will meet the required hours necessary for Kentucky Basic I Firefighter Certification. The “Awareness” level course is lecture-based, and topics discussed include, but are not limited to: Basic fire behavior and fire development; potential signs, elements, indicators of Flashover and Backdraft; Tactical Ventilation; and Survival techniques. Relevant case studies may also be discussed during the 4-hour version of this program

Wildland Awareness: Kentucky mandatory 4-hour Wildland Firefighting Awareness course developed for Kentucky firefighters seeking certification by the Kentucky Fire Commission. Case histories will be presented in the program so we may learn how to keep from repeating the mistakes made in other tragic events.

Prerequisites: Permission Form if Jr. Firefighter

Hazardous Materials Operations (T0002)

8 HOURS SUNDAY

This course is designed to expand on Hazardous Material Awareness level training. ***This is not a complete Operations level course but presents information on skills components of that certification level.*** “First responders at the operations level are individuals who respond to releases or potential releases of hazardous substances as part of the initial response to the site for the purpose of protecting nearby persons, property, or the environment from the effects of the release. They are trained to respond in a defensive fashion without actually trying to stop the release. Their function is to contain the release from a safe distance, keep it from spreading, and prevent exposures.” (OSHA) Skills *may* include classroom-based scenarios for command-and-control practice, selection and use of PPE and outside basic decontamination practices, including post-fire gross decontamination of turnout gear.

Equipment Needed: Full turnout gear including SCBA and PASS device

Prerequisites: None

Rope Rescue Operations (Q0007)

16 HOURS SATURDAY/SUNDAY

This is a hands-on class that prepares students for real-world technical rope rescues. This class covers the technical aspect of rope equipment, as well as:

- Practical applications of rappelling/lowering techniques
- Anchor systems
- Safety systems
- Communications

Students will learn techniques for life-saving operations in the vertical environment, while maintaining an adequate level of safety for the rescuer and the patient. Techniques will include rappels, lock-offs, inversions, belays, and working with litters. Students should come prepared to work.

Prerequisites: Attendance of a Basic/Awareness level class as taught by KCTCS, adequate fitness level to handle weight in sometimes awkward positions, and an ability/desire to work safely in a team effort.

Equipment Needed: Helmet with a chin strap and suspension system meeting UIAA, OSHA, NIOS, or NFPA standards, clean leather gloves that have not been used for fire fighting or chemicals handling, and sturdy boots that offer ankle support (no fire boots) as well as clothing to match the weather. Any personal equipment brought to the class will be the responsibility of the owner and will have to be inspected and approved by the instructors before use. This class is physically demanding and all hands on.

Pump Maintenance/Testing (Z0000)

16 HOURS SATURDAY/SUNDAY

Class will consist of basic pump maintenance going over truck checks, basic pump check and operations, documenting all needed information for pump testing, and how to set up and prepare for a pump test on or off site.

Prerequisites: None

NATIONAL FIRE ACADEMY SPONSORED CLASSES

NFA – Training Operations in Small Departments (O0290)

16 HOURS SATURDAY/SUNDAY

This 2-day course is designed to provide students with some basic tools and skills to coordinate training in a small fire/emergency medical services organization. A training function in a smaller department typically may include conducting training drills and coordinating training with a nearby larger city or state training function.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: None

NFA – Preparation for Initial Company Operations (O0458)

16 HOURS SATURDAY/SUNDAY

This 2-day course is designed to develop a better understanding of the role and responsibilities of Company Officers (COs) in preparing their company for incident operations and to clarify the transition from firefighter to CO and the new roles relating to leadership and safety.

This course is designed for COs, acting COs or senior firefighters responsible for the management of a single fire company at an emergency incident, including those officers who are responsible for company readiness, personnel safety, and leadership as it relates to company operation.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: None

NFA Certificates issued to those individuals with NFA ID <https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid/register> that complete the entire class including testing.



Thermal Imaging Orientation & Image Interpretation (II0000) 8 HOURS SUNDAY

This is a generic thermal imaging course that will give you the basic knowledge that you need to become confident in your abilities to use your thermal imager safely. Topics include Fundamentals, Operations, and Maintenance. Instructors will cover 25 plus applications for using thermal imagers in emergency situations.

Equipment Needed: None

Prerequisites: None



Traffic Incident Mgmt. for Responders & Highway Crash Site Mgmt. (B0000) 8 HOURS SATURDAY

This 8-hour block of instruction consists of two 4-hour classes. The Traffic Incident Management class details how temporary traffic control can be established and maintained by emergency responders on-the scene. The Highway Crash Site Management course focuses on inter-agency response to vehicle accidents and offers practical solutions to issues that may arise on-scene.

Vehicle Rescue Operations (Q0001) 16 HOURS SATURDAY/SUNDAY

This class introduces the proper methods of safely extricating patients from passenger vehicles that have been involved in various types of accidents. This class is a combination of a short classroom lecture that will familiarize the student with vehicle terminology, extrication tools, and principles. Hands on sessions will give the student the opportunity to assess, plan, and implement basic extrication strategies.

Equipment Needed: Full turnout gear or coveralls, helmet or hardhat, gloves, steel-toed shoes, and eye protection.

Prerequisites: Completion of Basic 20 hours.

Live Fire Course Competency Validation/Fitness for Duty Form

Required for all students before participating in SFRT Live Fire Training

NFPA1403(2018 Edition) 4.3.1-4.3.3 require that all participants must have prior training and meet prerequisites in certain subjects before participating in live fire training. These minimum subjects include:

1) Safety; 2) Fire Behavior; 3) Portable Extinguishers; 4) Personal Protective Equipment& SCBA; 5) Ladders; 6) Fire Hose, Appliances, and Streams; 7) Overhaul; 8) Water Supply; 9) Ventilation; 10) Forcible Entry; 11) Building Construction. Specific prerequisite training must also be met in these areas: Fire Dynamics; Health and Safety; Fundamentals of Fire Behavior; Fire Development in Compartments; Nozzle Techniques and Door Control.

The Chief Officer of _____ Fire Department authorizes that _____ completed the minimum training/prerequisites and may participate in the live fire training evolutions present by SFRT.

NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) 4.4.1 requires that all participants must be rehabbed in accordance with NFPA 1584, Chapter 6. Before being released from the rehab area to participate in a State Fire Rescue Training live fire training evolution, normal conditions are considered to consist of: heart rate of 60-100; respiratory rate of 12-20; systolic blood pressure less than 160; diastolic blood pressure of less than 100; pulse oximetry of 95% or greater. Participants are encouraged to periodically check their vital signs and seek appropriate medical attention for abnormal signs/symptoms.

Participants must at least 18 years old (Juniors 15-17) and be a member of a Fire Department, Industrial Fire Brigade or Junior Firefighter program (Ages 15-17) that is recognized by the Kentucky Fire Commission to participate in live fire training delivered by State Fire Rescue Training. ID's will be checked by SFRT instructors before allowing students to participate in live fire training and some evolutions/activities are restricted for 15-17-year-old Junior Firefighters (See current Junior Firefighter Guidelines on KY Fire Commission website.) All turnout gear must be less than 10 years of age. Per NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) A4.9.5 it is recommended that all participants wear full-length clothing made of natural fibers or fire-retardant materials under their personal protective equipment during live fire evolutions.

Facepiece seal protection: SFRT requires that all students must be compliant with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134:“1910.134(g)(1)(i) -The employer shall not permit respirators with tight-fitting facepieces to be worn by employees who have: 1910.134(g)(1)(i)(A) -Facial hair that comes between the sealing surface of the facepiece and the face or that interferes with valve function;” (hair growth between the skin and the facepiece sealing surface, such as stubble beard growth, beard, mustache or sideburns which cross the respirator sealing surface).

Live Fire Training Release Form

In consideration of the Kentucky Community and Technical College System ("KCTCS") Kentucky Fire Commission State Fire Rescue Training (referred to hereafter as "SFRT") allowing me to participate in this emergency service training class, I represent and agree as follows:

1. Assumption of Risk. I understand and acknowledge that the very nature of the training is dangerous and there are certain inherent risks associated with participating in the training, including but not limited to fire- related risks. I understand that the specific risks vary, but that they include injury, loss, or damage to myself or my property, or death, resulting from exposure to fire and unsafe conditions. I understand that efforts will be made by the instructional staff to create a working environment that is as safe as possible, and that the instructional staff will give me careful and prudent instruction in the operation of equipment and how to perform each task. However, I also understand that neither KCTCS nor SFRT – nor their respective boards, officers, agents, or employees – has control over these inherent risks, and that the risks cannot be eliminated completely regardless of the care taken by KCTCS or SFRT. By signing below, I represent that I appreciate the risks. I accept and voluntarily assume all risks that may arise from or in connection with my participation in the training. I understand that I am ultimately responsible for my own safety, and for my actions at all times.

2. Participation. I agree to perform only those activities specifically designated for the training, to follow all instructions and directions given to me by the instructional staff, and to adhere to all applicable safety standards. I will not participate in any activity that is not directly related to the training and class function, and I will ask for additional information before I proceed with a training procedure if I am unsure of the procedure or of the instructions and directions given.

3. Workers' Compensation. I understand that in order to participate in this training, I must be a member in good standing with a fire department or response agency, and I must be covered by the workers' compensation insurance of that department or agency. By signing this document, I certify that I meet these requirements. I understand that in the event of any accident or injury, any workers' compensation claim must be made under the coverage of my department or agency. I will also report such an accident or injury to the administrative officer of my fire department or response agency as soon as is reasonably practicable, but in no event more than 24 hours after the accident or injury.

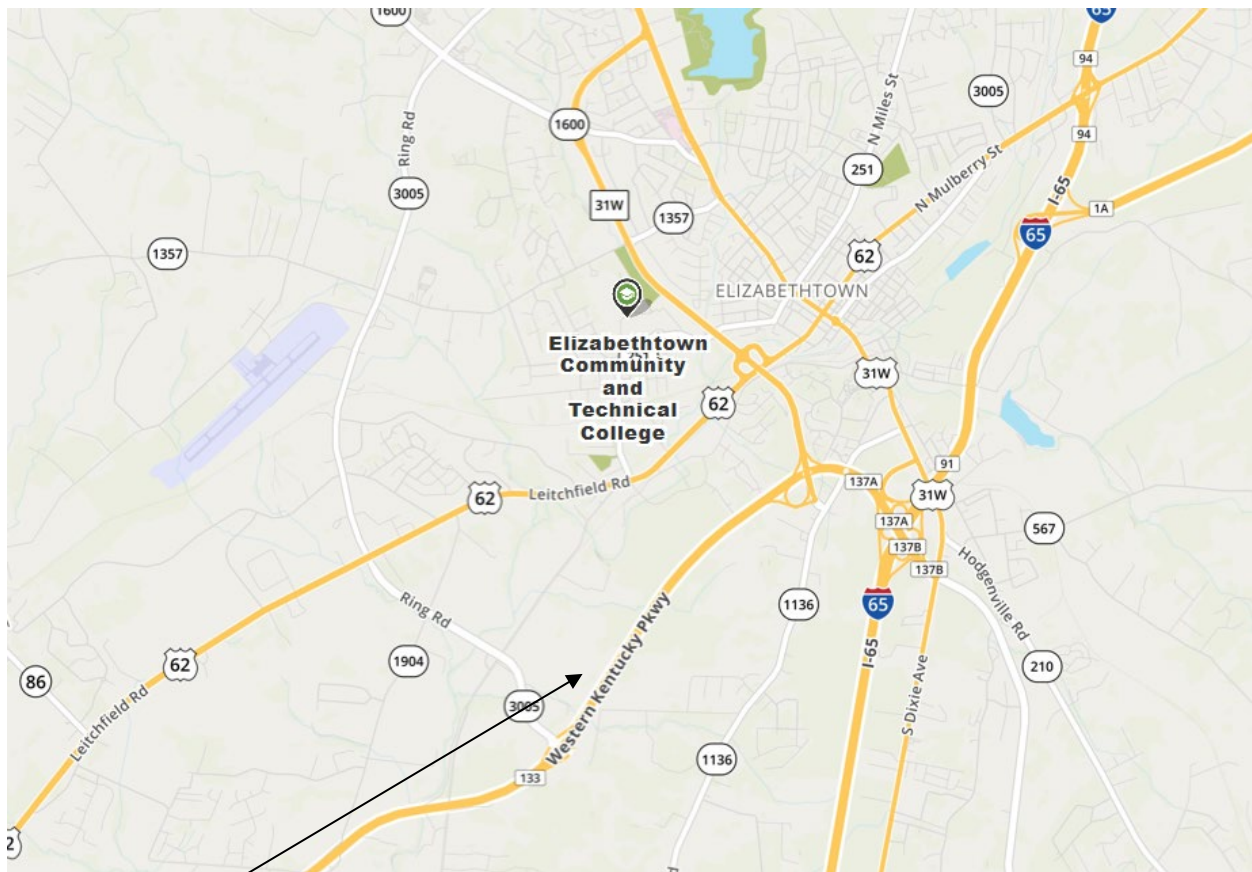
From the North – I-65 South to exit 94, right on 62, go 2.5 miles to 31W bypass, turn left at 1st red light, ECTC is on the right.

From the West – Western KY Parkway, exit 136 turn left, go ½ mile, turn left at 1st red light, ECTC is on the right.

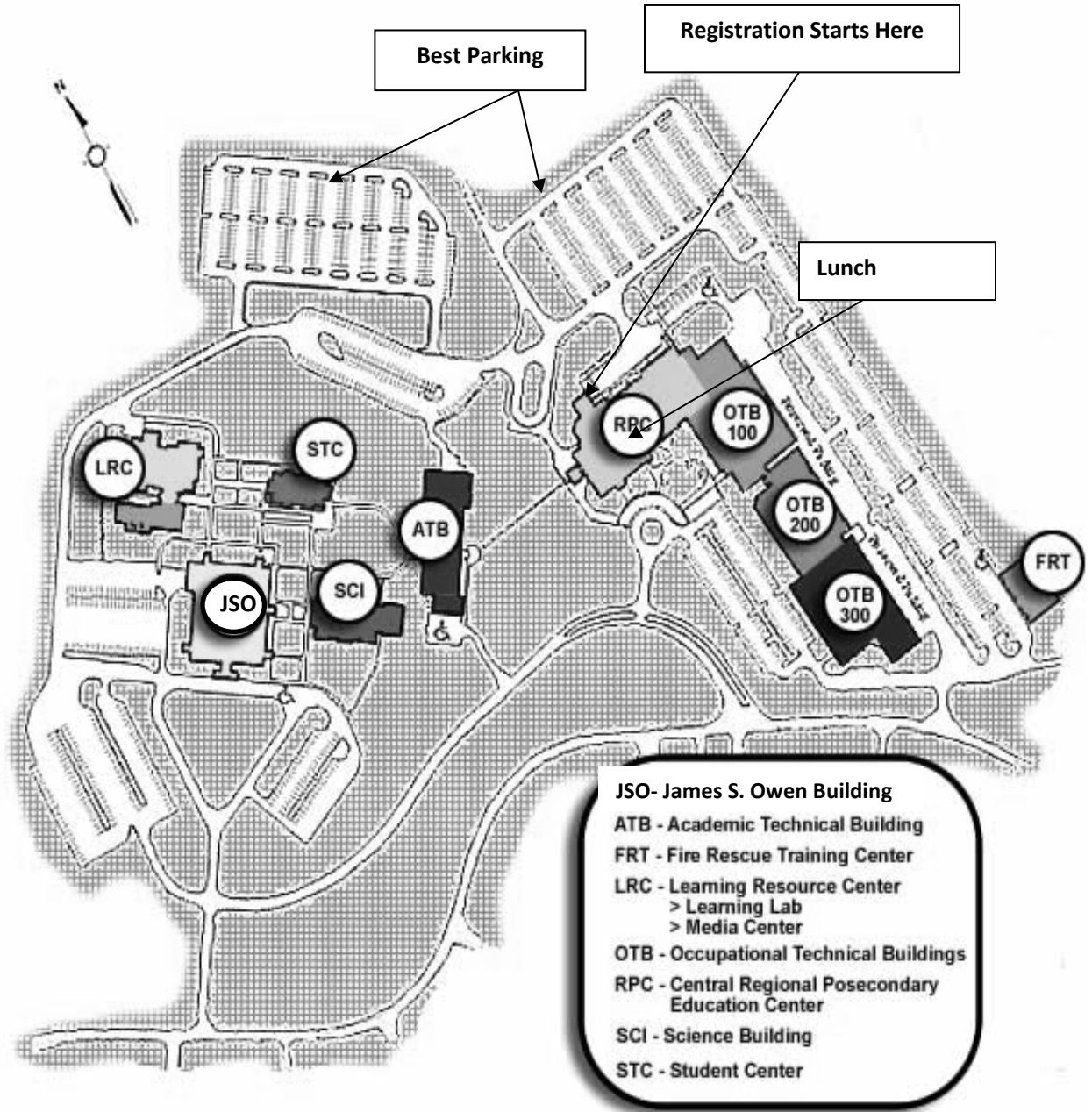
