COURSE LISTINGS

(1) Instructor Methodology: Friday Night

This course is designed for company officers & other fire service instructors with the responsibility of conducting training at your department. Emphasis on teaching principles & techniques applicable to the fire service. It includes effective communication, teaching from lesson plans, with an emphasis on skills training & adult learning. **This class meets the requirements of Instructor update training set forth by Ky Fire Commission.**

(2) Landing Zone Awareness: Friday Night

You will learn everything you need to know about helipad safety, setting up a secure and safe landing zone, and common emergencies requiring air transport of patients.

(3) Thermal Imaging Camera Operations: Friday Night

This course will teach you the ins & outs of a Thermal Imaging Camera (T I C). How correct operations can benefit you & your department during fire ground operations, victim search & rescue, overhaul, searching for lost people, just to name a few

(4) Rural Water Supply: Friday - Sunday (20 Hrs.)

This class will start Friday evening and run through Sunday. Students will start off in the classroom and do hands-on training Saturday & Sunday. Many factors make up rural water supply training, including how much fire flow is necessary for fire suppression on a structure based on the dimension of the structure. Topics and considerations include, locations of the nearest water resources, shuttle operations (water haul), pumper relay operations and the amount of water flow available from a hydrant. Examples will also be given of alternative static water supply sources typical in a rural setting. **PPE is required for ALL hands-on training.**

(5) Rope Rescue Awareness & Operations: Friday - Sunday (20 hrs.)

This course provides information on low-angle and high-angle rescue, familiarizing participants with operation of simple, complex, and compound rope rescue systems in the low-and high-angle environment. This is a two-day hands-on class taught on Saturday and Sunday. You must have attended the Rope Rescue Awareness class taught on Friday evening to attend the second phase of this class. Operations level rope class addresses the equipment and techniques required to safely access, stabilize, and remove victims of elevated, or below grade accidents/illnesses. The class meets and exceeds the Operations Level objectives as outlined in NFPA 1670 and 1006. The student will be challenged to engineer systems that defy gravity in order to affect above and below grade rescues. **All students need an approved rescue helmet, gloves, and boots that provide ankle support.**

(6) EMT Con-Ed: Friday – Sunday (20 hrs.)

This class will offer the 20 hours required for an EMR or EMT to have for recertification by KBEMS. This class will be a combination of lecture and hands – on, and will cover topics including Airway, Medical, Trauma, Cardiac and Operations.

(7) Lithium Batteries & Hybrid Vehicles: Saturday Only

Bikes, scooters and other devices have become popular modes of transportation. These devices often use lithium-ion battery technology because of the decreased weight and high energy density associated with this technology. These types of fires burn hotter and faster and require special considerations and tactics. This course provides first responders with the knowledge to respond to these types of incidents. Part II of this course will highlight electric vehicle fires in parking structures. As electric vehicles (EVs) have become increasingly popular, it's essential for parking garage operators, emergency responders, and EV owners to understand the unique challenges and safety considerations related to EV fires. This comprehensive course provides participants with the knowledge and skills needed to effectively mitigate, respond to, and prevent electric vehicle fires in parking garages.

(8) Traffic Incident Management (TIMS): Sunday Only

Better incident response improves the safety of responders and drivers, reduces crashes that occur because of incident-related congestion, decreases traffic delays caused by incidents, and can cut incident response time. The National Traffic Incident Management Responder Training was created by responders for responders. This course provides first responders with a shared understanding of the requirements for safe, quick clearance of traffic incident scenes; prompt, reliable and open communication; and motorist and responder safeguards. First responders learn how to operate more efficiently and collectively.

(9) Advanced Vehicle Extrication:

Students should have the basic knowledge and experience of vehicle extrication. This will be classroom and hands-on. Students will be performing extrication on vehicles that have been T Bone, under ride, vehicle on their side and top.

All students will need appropriate PPE (turnout gear or extrication suits. Gloves, Boots, Helmet & Eye protection, & SCBA on Sunday)

(10)) You Pick It:

This 2-day course is a twist on the “hard to get hours”. Show up to class with a list of training hours you need and whatever topics have the highest need of those attending class will be the topics covered. **NO FC CLASSES WILL BE OFFERED**

(11) Basic Firefighting Skills:

This 2-day course is primarily hands-on training. Topics covered will be fire extinguisher, PPE, salvage & overhaul, forcible entry, hose nozzle & appliances, ventilation, ladders, victim search & rescue. (30 MAX.) **FULL TURN-OUT GEAR & SCBA REQUIRED**

(12) Strategy & Tactics for Initial Company Officer: (NFA STICO)

This 2-day course is designed to meet the needs of Company Officers (COs) responsible for managing the operations of 1 or more companies during structural firefighting operations. This course is designed to develop the management skills needed by COs to accomplish assigned tactics at structure fires.

(13) Live Fire Training: (1403 House Burn)

A two-days, intense hands-on firefighting that will challenge even the veteran firefighter. 2 days of Live Fire Training.

Full PPE, including SCBA and an extra bottle, is required for this course. **NO BEARDS OR GOATEES ALLOWED.** A Live Fire Competency Validation Form **MUST** be completed in full and given to the Lead Instructor prior to participation in this class. This form is attached to your fire school brochure.

JRFF Program Coordinator **SHALL** provide all JRFF's with a Training and Emergency Contact Information Form prior to the JRFF attending classes outside of the JRFF primary department. The information included above is required at a minimum. Fire Departments may collect more information if necessary.

Inform participating Junior Firefighters that they must keep a copy of this form with them at all times while participating in the fire department activities. Class instructors and/or school/conference leadership may randomly request to see a copy of the form during the conduct of classes and/or event. If the participant is unable to provide a copy, the instructor, other department leadership, or conference organizers shall not allow the child to continue participation until the form is produced.

Live Fire Course Competency Validation/Fitness for Duty Form Required for all students before participating in SFRT Live Fire Training

NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) 4.3.1 - 4.3.3 require that all participants must have prior training and meet prerequisites in certain subjects before participating in live fire training. These minimum subjects include:

1) Safety; 2) Fire Behavior; 3) Portable Extinguishers; 4) Personal Protective Equipment & SCBA; 5) Ladders; 6) Fire Hose, Appliances, and Streams; 7) Overhaul; 8) Water Supply; 9) Ventilation; 10) Forcible Entry; 11) Building Construction. Specific prerequisite training must also be met in these areas: Fire Dynamics; Health and Safety; Fundamentals of Fire Behavior; Fire Development in Compartments; Nozzle Techniques and Door Control.

The Chief Officer of _____ Fire Department authorizes that _____ completed the minimum training/prerequisites and may participate in the live fire training evolutions present by SFRT.

NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) 4.4.1 requires that all participants must be rehabbed in accordance with NFPA 1584, Chapter 6. Before being released from the rehab area to participate in a State Fire Rescue Training live fire training evolution, normal conditions are considered to consist of: heart rate of 60-100; respiratory rate of 12-20; systolic blood pressure less than 160; diastolic blood pressure of less than 100; pulse oximetry of 95% or greater. Participants are encouraged to periodically check their vital signs and seek appropriate medical attention for abnormal signs/symptoms.

Participants must be a member of a Fire Department, Industrial Fire Brigade or Junior Firefighter program (Ages 15-17) that is recognized by the Kentucky Fire Commission to participate in live fire training delivered by State Fire Rescue Training. ID's will be checked by SFRT instructors before allowing students to participate in live fire training and some evolutions/activities are restricted for 15-17 year old Junior Firefighters (See current Junior Firefighter Guidelines on KY Fire Commission website.) All turnout gear must be less than 10 years of age. Per NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) A4.9.5 it is recommended that all participants wear full-length clothing made of natural fibers or fire-retardant materials under their personal protective equipment during live fire evolutions.

Facepiece seal protection: SFRT requires that all students must be compliant with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134:

"[1910.134\(g\)\(1\)\(i\)](#) - The employer shall not permit respirators with tight-fitting facepieces to be worn by employees who have: [1910.134\(g\)\(1\)\(i\)\(A\)](#) - Facial hair that comes between the sealing surface of the facepiece and the face or that interferes with valve function;" (hair growth between the skin and the facepiece sealing surface, such as stubble beard growth, beard, mustache or sideburns which cross the respirator sealing surface).

Live Fire Training Release Form

In consideration of the Kentucky Community and Technical College System ("KCTCS") Kentucky Fire Commission State Fire Rescue Training (referred to hereafter as "SFRT") allowing me to participate in this emergency service training class, I represent and agree as follows:

1. Assumption of Risk. I understand and acknowledge that the very nature of the training is dangerous and there are certain inherent risks associated with participating in the training, including but not limited to fire-related risks. I understand that the specific risks vary, but that they include injury, loss, or damage to myself or my property, or death, resulting from exposure to fire and unsafe conditions. I understand that efforts will be made by the instructional staff to create a working environment that is as safe as possible, and that the instructional staff will give me careful and prudent instruction in the operation of equipment and how to perform each task. However, I also understand that neither KCTCS nor SFRT – nor their respective boards, officers, agents, or employees – has control over these inherent risks, and that the risks cannot be eliminated completely regardless of the care taken by KCTCS or SFRT. By signing below, I represent that I appreciate the risks. I accept and voluntarily assume all risks that may arise from or in connection with my participation in the training. I understand that I am ultimately responsible for my own safety, and for my actions at all times.

2. Participation. I agree to perform only those activities specifically designated for the training, to follow all instructions and directions given to me by the instructional staff, and to adhere to all applicable safety standards. I will not participate in any activity that is not directly related to the training and class function, and I will ask for additional information before I proceed with a training procedure if I am unsure of the procedure or of the instructions and directions given.

3. Workers' Compensation. I understand that in order to participate in this training, I must be a member in good standing with a fire department or response agency, and I must be covered by the workers' compensation insurance of that department or agency. By signing this document, I certify that I meet these requirements. I understand that in the event of any accident or injury, any workers' compensation claim must be made under the coverage of my department or agency. In no event will I request workers' compensation coverage from KCTCS or SFRT and either KCTCS or SFRT will be responsible for any accident or injury.

4. Release and Hold Harmless. I understand that participating in the training may result in injury, loss, or damage to myself or my property, or death, and neither KCTCS or SFRT – nor their respective boards, officers, agents, or employees – will be responsible or liable for such injury, loss, damage, or death. By signing below, I release, hold harmless, and forever discharge KCTCS or SFRT – and their respective boards, officers, agents, and employees – from any and all claims, causes of action, or demands of every kind by reason of any injury to person or property, or death, arising from or in connection with my participation in this training.

5. Alcohol and Medications. I agree and represent that I will not consume alcoholic beverages or any prescription or non-prescription medications or other controlled substances that may impair my judgment or reaction time within the five (5) hours prior to any class, or during class.

6. Live Fire. I understand that this training involves live fire, I must have completed certain FF1 and FF2 job performing requirements, as set forth in NFPA 1001 and 1403 directives.

7. Accident or Injury. I agree and represent that in the event of any accident or injury, I will report such accident or injury IMMEDIATELY to the instructional staff. I will also report such accident or injury to the administrative officer of my fire department or response agency as soon as is reasonably practicable, but in no event more than 24 hours after the accident or injury.

By signing below, I agree that I have been given sufficient time to read, understand, and ask questions, if any, concerning the nature and scope of this Release. I understand that any breach of the above stated items could result in my immediate dismissal from class.
