(1) EMT REFRESHER

This is a three-day course taught on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday that will cover all training requirements as set forth by the Kentucky Board of Emergency Medical Services (KBEMS) and the National Registry of EMT's for the 24-hour EMT Refresher Class/NCCP and incorporate both lecture and practical experience, including competency testing. *Sponsored by Air EVAC*

(2) ROPE RESCUE AWARENESS

This is a four-hour class held on Friday evening only and is a <u>prerequisite for taking Rope Rescue</u> <u>Operations</u> which follows on Saturday and Sunday. This course provides information on low-angle and high-angle rescue, familiarizing participants with operation of simple, complex, and compound rope rescue systems in the low-and high-angle environment.

(3) ROPE RESCUE OPERATIONS

Pre-registration is required for this class and is limited to 24 students. This is a two-day hands-on class taught on Saturday and Sunday. You must have attended the Rope Rescue Awareness class taught on Friday evening (May 20th) to attend this class. Operations level rope class addresses the equipment and techniques required to safely access, stabilize, and remove victims of elevated, or below grade accidents/illnesses. The class meets and exceeds the Operations Level objectives as outlined in NFPA 1670 and 1006. The student will be challenged to engineer systems that defy gravity in order to affect above and below grade rescues. All students need an approved rescue helmet, gloves, and boots that provide ankle support.

*Rope Rescue Awareness and Operations courses must be successfully completed to participate in the Rope Rescue Technician class which will be held on May 28th and 29th. As with the Rope Rescue Operations class, pre-registration for the Technician class is required and will also be limited to 24 students.

(4) ROPE RESCUE TECHNICIAN

Pre-registration is required for this class and is limited to 24 students. This is a two-day hands-on class taught on Saturday, May 28th and Sunday, May 29th. You must have successfully completed the Rope Rescue Awareness/Operations classes to attend this class. Rope Rescue Technician is the ultimate advanced level rope class designed to give the accomplished student the ability to perform techniques that involve tensioned rope systems. This class meets and exceeds the NFPA requirements for Technician Level training. Students will build systems to remove victims on rope systems that are horizontal or angled to the ground. A fitting conclusion to the rope rescue program will leave the student with the knowledge, skills, abilities, and theoretical background necessary to perform even the most difficult rescues. All students need an approved rescue helmet, gloves, and boots that provide ankle support.

*This class will cover Awareness, Operations, and Technician Rope Rescue techniques as required to meet NFPA 1006. Students shall be physically capable of performing and demonstrating the skills required for meeting NFPA 1006.

(5) TOOLS OF THE TRADE

This isn't a course that teaches all you need to know about ventilation, forcible entry, or other basic fire theory. It's all about the equipment needed to perform those tasks. Students will be expected to use tools in evolution concentrating on hand tools and power tools. Each session will start with tool inspection and maintenance, review of manufacturer's guidance, and discussions of safety. Multiple stations will involve the student in correct tool use. Hands-on activities will be the primary focus of the class. Firefighting PPE is required for each student. All students will need SCBA and full turnout gear including fire gloves and leather gloves.

*Prerequisites: Permission form if Jr. Firefighter; Live Fire Competency Validation form for live fire participation; knowledge of forcible entry and ventilation basics. Portions of this class will be physically demanding. (Jr. FF forms and Live Fire Competency Validation forms are available on our website at www.sfrt9.com under the Downloadable documents link or you can contact our SFRT9 office for these forms)

(6) INSTRUCTOR METHODOLOGY UPDATE

This class is designed for company officers and other fire or rescue service personnel with the responsibility of conducting periodic company level or small unit training, introducing the participant to basic instructional concepts and techniques. Emphasis is on teaching principles and techniques applicable to fire and rescue service training and includes effective communication, teaching from lesson plans, methods of instruction, with emphasis on skills training, and adult learning. This session will focus on current technologies available to enhance your presentation. This course meets one of the requirements for newly announced Fire Service Instructor recertification as published in 739 Kentucky Administrative Regulation (KAR) 2:060. For additional information regarding recertification, please contact your local SFRT district office.

(7) ACTIVE SHOOTER/HOSTILE EVENTS

Fire Departments are increasingly called upon to assist in complex and large Criminal Mass Casualty Incidents (C-MCI). These events are unpredictable and progress quickly, leaving first responders in a position of need for training to address responses to these unique situations. C-MCI have led to specific recommendations and guidelines for emergency response personnel to improve functionality and interoperability between Fire/EMS and law enforcement agencies. The Kentucky Fire Commission invites you to engage in awareness level training for better management of pre-incident planning and how to best mitigate casualties in a C-MCI situation.

(8) RESCUE TECHNICIAN REFRESHER

This is a two-day course taught on Saturday and Sunday and is designed to provide hands-on training that will allow students to stay up to date on various rescue scenarios. The course will consist primarily of outside skills practice of the topics of Static Water Rescue, Low-Angle Rope Rescue, Machinery Entrapment Rescue, and Elevator Rescue. Students need approved rescue helmet, gloves, and boots that provide ankle support and Water Rescue PPE including a Type III PFD.

(9) SUICIDE AWARENESS & PTSD/SILENT MAYDAY

The fire service has long been about helping others; these days more than ever, that includes fellow firefighters. The Silent Mayday is a Strategy and Tactics Course for Fire Service Suicide Intervention and Prevention. This class will discuss suicide prevention, awareness training and intervention techniques for use among first responder personnel and their families. Students will come away with the ability to understand the stress, pressure, and culture in fire service that can lead to suicidal ideation. Topics include how to develop strategies to train fire service personnel in suicide prevention, recognize the importance of establishing department policy and procedures related to suicide prevention and post-reaction, how to convey the importance of all the above during future fire service suicide prevention training, identify behaviors and communication and understand, identify, prevent, and limit affects of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).
