Its scope is limited to giving detailed information about the initial defensive operations. The course addresses the first responders' responsibilities to recognize the presence of hazardous materials, secure the area, provide personnel protection, and request the assistance of trained technicians. Additionally, it addresses the control of hazardous materials releases from a safe distance using defensive operations.

Topics included are roles of fire chaplains, how to minister to firefighters, how to minister to fire victims, critical incident stress, fire department funerals, basic fire chaplain operations, etc. Successful completion of this class will partially fulfill the training requirements necessary to become a certified chaplain by the Kentucky Fire Commission. Information about the duties and tasks of SAR field responders, current information on SAR field responder clothing and equipment as well as details on the latest search techniques, information on SAR specialties such as hasty search, grid search, utilizing specialty teams, subject packaging, and transport. There will be an afternoon search all students must have sturdy shoes (no tennis shoes) and are asked to dress appropriately for the weather. If you have a SAR pack, please bring it for the exercise.

This course is open to all Emergency Management, Rescue, Fire, Emergency Medical, and Law Enforcement personnel or any organization having responsibility for searching for missing or lost persons. You must be at least 18 years old to register for this course.

### Flashover Recognition

8 Hour Class

Sunday 27th 8am-5pm

This course is designed to provide the fire service with a safe and secure method of flashover training. Firefighters are taught to recognize the signs of flashover and provided techniques of possibly escaping impending flashover with the goal of saving firefighters from injury or death.

#### **Turnout gear and SCBA required**

**Prerequisites:** You must be at least 18 years of age and a member of a Fire Department or an Industrial Fire Brigade recognized by the Kentucky Fire Commission to participate in LIVE FIRE delivered by State Fire Rescue Training. All Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) of the above referenced student is less than ten (10) years from the date of manufacture. Any student with facial hair that impedes the seal of the face piece will not be allowed to participate in accordance with NFPA Standards.

A form will be emailed to the student upon registration that will need to be signed by the Chief of the fire department being represented and will need to be sent back in or brought to class. Please provide a valid email address when registering for the class.

If the student does not have this form, they will not be able to participate in the class.

### Modern Firefighting Techniques

8 Hour Class  
Saturday 8am.-5pm

This course will cover the Strategies and Tactics necessary to successfully attack and extinguish various types of structure or building fires encountered by firefighters in suburban, small-city or rural fire departments.

The course will include a brief review of the Incident Management System, the 13-point size-up considerations, and IMS Tactical Priorities. It will also include a discussion of strategies and tactics for various types of buildings such as single-family dwellings, garden apartment buildings, larger apartment buildings, strip-mall and “tax-payer” commercial and mixed-occupancy buildings, “Big-Box” commercial buildings, and rural barn-type buildings.

Discussions will also include the utilization of public or private water supplies as well as tanker-shuttle operations.

Discussions will also include Mutual-Aid agreements between volunteer and career fire departments when needing to share manpower and resources at serious fires.

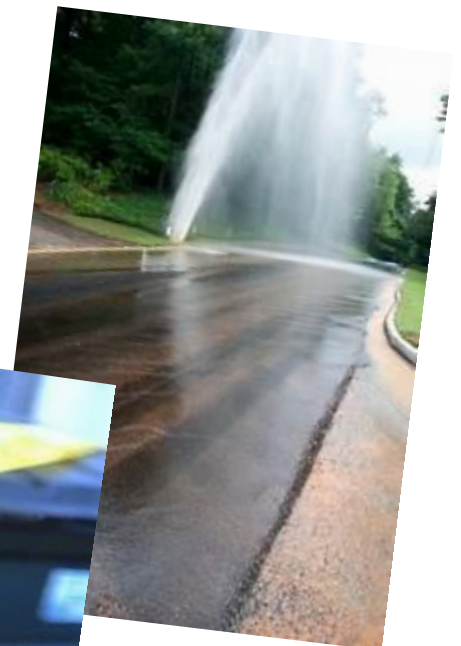

### Pumper Theory & Operations

8 Hour Class

Firefighters need to be trained to operate the pumping apparatus, as operated by their fire department. Personnel should be trained in the daily, weekly, or monthly maintenance needed for the pumping apparatus. Training shall be consistent with the latest edition of job performance requirements of NFPA 1002 “Standard for Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator Professional Qualifications.” ROUTINE MAINTENANCE DUTIES, PUMP OPERATIONS ON FIRE GROUNDS OR TESTING IS NOT CONSIDERED TRAINING. Examples of topics for this category include, but are not limited to:

1. Components which are needed to classify a fire apparatus
2. Calculation of friction loss and elevation loss/gain
3. How to obtain the static pressure
4. Steps required for establishing a pumping operation from a draft
5. Use of fire ground calculations during a theoretical incident

### Flammable Liquids & Gasses

8 Hour Class

Sunday 27th 8am-5pm

Flammable and combustible liquid incidents are a very common types of hazardous-materials incident to which fire departments respond. These liquids, present in almost every home and workplace, are particularly hazardous due to their ability to produce vapors and can ignite easily, burn with extreme rapidity, emit a large amount of heat and often produce clouds of thick, black, toxic smoke. Preparation and proper training are essential for firefighters handling incidents involving flammable liquids and gases.

Participants in this course will learn backgrounds of flammable liquids and gases, storage and transport of these products, and how to safely respond to propane emergencies frequently encountered by emergency personnel.

Although there are specific places through which firefighters usually force entrance into a building, a general knowledge of how buildings are constructed is also essential. It is important for firefighters to be familiar with the various trade terms in construction so that they can better judge both where and how to force entrance. Likewise, various tools and devices best suited for forcible entry procedure must be thoroughly understood by firefighters.

Examples of topics for this category include, but are not limited to:

1. Cutting, prying, pushing/pulling, and striking tools
2. Correct methods for carrying forcible entry tools
3. Safety rules for breaking glass
4. Swinging, sliding, revolving, and overhead doors
5. Opening floors and walls

Hours recorded in this category must have an instructor of record that is an active State Fire Rescue Training Instructor.

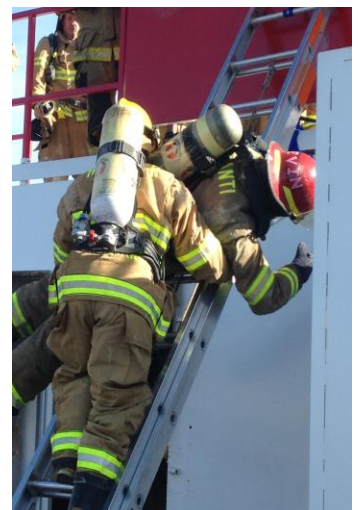

# Live Fire Course Competency Validation/Fitness for Duty Form

## Required for all students before participating in SFRT Live Fire Training

NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) 4.3.1 - 4.3.3 require that all participants must have prior training and meet prerequisites in certain subjects before participating in live fire training. These minimum subjects include:

1) Safety; 2) Fire Behavior; 3) Portable Extinguishers; 4) Personal Protective Equipment & SCBA; 5) Ladders; 6) Fire Hose, Appliances, and Streams; 7) Overhaul; 8) Water Supply; 9) Ventilation; 10) Forcible Entry; 11) Building Construction. Specific prerequisite training must also be met in these areas: Fire Dynamics; Health and Safety; Fundamentals of Fire Behavior; Fire Development in Compartments; Nozzle Techniques and Door Control.

NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) 4.4.1 requires that all participants must be rehabbed in accordance with NFPA 1584, Chapter 6. Before being released from the rehab area to participate in a State Fire Rescue Training live fire training evolution, normal conditions are considered to consist of: heart rate of 60-100; respiratory rate of 12-20; systolic blood pressure less than 160; diastolic blood pressure of less than 100; pulse oximetry of 95% or greater. Participants are encouraged to periodically check their vital signs and seek appropriate medical attention for abnormal signs/symptoms.

**Participants must be a member of a Fire Department, Industrial Fire Brigade or Junior Firefighter program (Ages 15-17) that is recognized by the Kentucky Fire Commission to participate in live fire training delivered by State Fire Rescue Training. ID's will be checked by SFRT instructors before allowing students to participate in live fire training and some evolutions/activities are restricted for 15-17 year old Junior Firefighters (See current Junior Firefighter Guidelines on KY Fire Commission website.) All turnout gear must be less than 10 years of age. Per NFPA 1403 (2018 Edition) A4.9.5 it is recommended that all participants wear full-length clothing made of natural fibers or fire-retardant materials under their personal protective equipment during live fire evolutions.**

Facepiece seal protection: SFRT requires that all students must be compliant with OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134:

“[1910.134\(g\)\(1\)\(i\)](#) -The employer shall not permit respirators with tight-fitting facepieces to be worn by employees who have: [1910.134\(g\)\(1\)\(i\)\(A\)](#) - Facial hair that comes between the sealing surface of the facepiece and the face or that interferes with valve function;” (hair growth between the skin and the facepiece sealing surface, such as stubble beard growth, beard, mustache or sideburns which cross the respirator sealing surface).

In consideration of the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (“KCTCS”) Kentucky Fire Commission State Fire Rescue Training (referred to hereafter as “SFRT”) allowing me to participate in this emergency service training class, I represent and agree as follows:

1. Assumption of Risk. I understand and acknowledge that the very nature of the training is dangerous and there are certain inherent risks associated with participating in the training, including but not limited to fire-related risks. I understand that the specific risks vary, but that they include injury, loss, or damage to myself or my property, or death, resulting from exposure to fire and unsafe conditions. I understand that efforts will be made by the instructional staff to create a working environment that is as safe as possible, and that the instructional staff will give me careful and prudent instruction in the operation of equipment and how to perform each task. However, I also understand that neither KCTCS nor SFRT – nor their respective boards, officers, agents, or employees – has control over these inherent risks, and that the risks cannot be eliminated completely regardless of the care taken by KCTCS or SFRT. By signing below, I represent that I appreciate the risks. I accept and voluntarily assume all risks that may arise from or in connection with my participation in the training. I understand that I am ultimately responsible for my own safety, and for my actions at all times.

2. Participation. I agree to perform only those activities specifically designated for the training, to follow all instructions and directions given to me by the instructional staff, and to adhere to all applicable safety standards. I will not participate in any activity that is not directly related to the training and class function, and I will ask for additional information before I proceed with a training procedure if I am unsure of the procedure or of the instructions and directions given.

3. Workers’ Compensation. I understand that in order to participate in this training, I must be a member in good standing with a fire department or response agency, and I must be covered by the workers’ compensation insurance of that department or agency. By signing this document, I certify that I meet these requirements. I understand that in the event of any accident or injury, any workers’ compensation claim must be made under the coverage of my department or agency. In no event will I request workers’ compensation coverage from KCTCS or SFRT and either KCTCS or SFRT will be responsible for any accident or injury.

4. Release and Hold Harmless. I understand that participating in the training may result in injury, loss, or damage to myself or my property, or death, and neither KCTCS or SFRT – nor their respective boards, officers, agents, or employees – will be responsible or liable for such injury, loss, damage, or death. By signing below, I release, hold harmless, and forever discharge KCTCS or SFRT – and their respective boards, officers, agents, and employees – from any and all claims, causes of action, or demands of every kind by reason of any injury to person or property, or death, arising from or in connection with my participation in this training.
