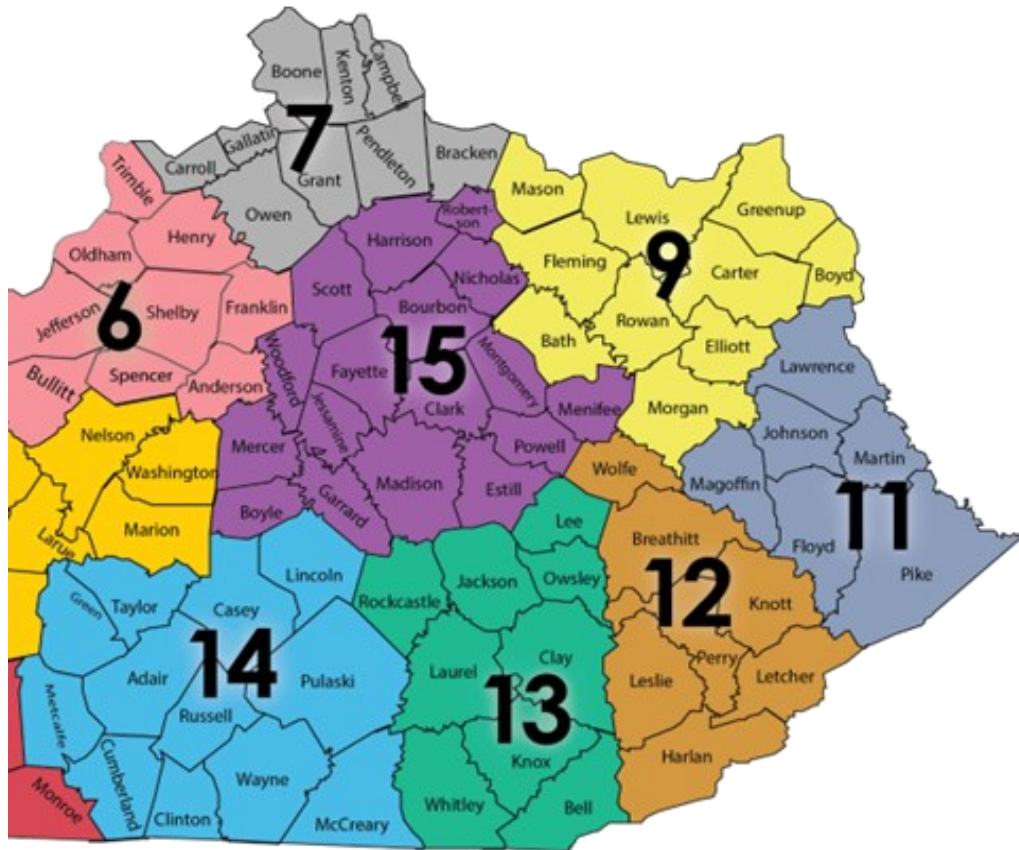

SPECIALTY COURSES

Along with providing a full menu of educational programs for all levels of firefighting experience, the Kentucky Fire Commission offers a number of specialty courses to help firefighters prepare for incidents they may encounter in their local service areas, including:

Active Shooter & Hostile Events (ASHER)

This course presents an overview of best practices for Fire/EMS personnel when working with law enforcement at the scene of an active shooter incident. Topics include pre-incident planning, including the importance of joint training exercises, an introduction to Tactical Emergency Casualty Care and a review of emergency medical treatment skills for high-threat environments and extrication techniques.

Alternative Fuel Vehicle Safety

This course is designed to provide responders with the information needed to properly identify an alternative fuel vehicle by visual indicators, provide an understanding of alternative fuel vehicle systems and hazards, and describes proper response procedures that ensure the safety of emergency personnel.

ATV/UTV Rescue

This program is designed to review skills and provide refresher training guidelines for emergency service organizations that use specialty UTV/ATVs to respond to off-road incidents. Participants in this course will have the opportunity to gain and/or verify a broad range of competencies and best practices associated with driving/operating UTV/ATVs.

Basic Fire Investigation for Kentucky Firefighters

This course provides a practical overview of key points, Kentucky Revised Statutes (KRS) and other issues as they relate to Kentucky firefighters. The goal is to provide a greater understanding of the fire investigation process through education, which will enhance cooperation among agencies and ultimately allow for a more effective fire investigation process.

Manufactured Housing Fires

This course was designed to educate Kentucky's Fire Service on the topic of Manufactured Housing Fires. These structures are unique from other structures in many ways and are ultimately a challenge for firefighters when they are involved in a fire. This course primarily focuses on single-wide manufactured housing or what many people term a "mobile home" or "trailer."

NFA FEATURE COURSES

In addition to local and state programs, State Fire Rescue Training (SFRT) is the Kentucky connection to the National Fire Academy (NFA). SFRT has been empowered by the National Fire Academy to deliver a wide range of NFA courses. Featured classes in leadership and development of all levels include:

Initial Company Operations Series

- ***Decision-Making for Initial Company Operations:*** Training for Company Officers (COs) to master vital decision-making skills at structure fires to accomplish assigned tactics, positively impact all aspects of the incident and produce a favorable outcome.
- ***Preparation for Initial Company Operations:*** Develop a better understanding of the roles and responsibilities of COs in preparing their company for incident operations, and learn about the transition from firefighter to CO.
- ***Strategy and Tactics for Initial Company Operations:*** Develop the management skills needed by COs for managing the operations of one or more companies and accomplishing assigned tactics during structural firefighting operations.

Leadership in Supervision Series

- ***Creating Environments for Professional Growth:*** Supervisors can learn the basic leadership skills and tools needed for effective performance in the Fire/EMS environment, including adaptive leadership, change management and effective communication.
- ***Frameworks to Success:*** Supervisors can learn leadership skills and tools needed to perform effectively in the Fire/EMS environment, including professionalism, resilience, emotional intelligence and situational awareness.
- ***Perspectives in Thinking:*** Supervisors can gain a conceptual foundation for success in leadership roles by exploring creative, analytical, political and critical thinking perspectives, such as fostering creativity and innovation.

New Fire Chief Series

- ***Challenging Issues:*** Understand the critical knowledge and resources and learn the essential skills necessary for assuming the responsibilities of a fire chief, including local politics and liability and risk management.
- ***Administrative Issues:*** New or recently appointed or elected chiefs can learn the crucial managerial, administrative and leadership skills and awareness necessary to successfully meet the obligations of the position.
- ***Contemporary Issues:*** New or recently appointed or elected fire chiefs can develop the managerial and leadership skills, and gain awareness of contemporary issues, necessary to meet their obligations now and in the future.

DEGREE PROGRAM

Students enrolled into the KCTCS Associate of Applied Science in Fire Science Technology degree program will learn the skills of fire suppression and prevention, technical rescue, hazardous materials, emergency medical care, and leadership. This program is beneficial whether students are seeking a career in emergency services (Fire, Rescue, EMS or Emergency Management) or if students are already providing fire, rescue or EMS services in their community.

Select course work may be transferred to a 4-year institution. Several courses are available on an online platform. Students must participate in a minimum of 25% of course work at their registered home college to qualify for credentialing.

Students who currently are part of a fire department and hold certain accredited certifications may be eligible to obtain college credit for prior learning.
